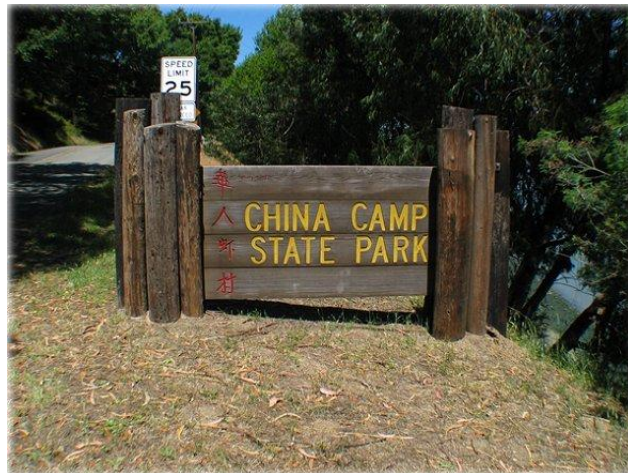


## China Camp State Park in Jeopardy

China Camp State Park offers spectacular bay vistas, oak forested hills, meadows, beaches, extensive salt marshes, wildlife, and a historic Chinese fishing village museum – all within an easy drive from urban centers. It offers a wide range of activities from hiking, biking, camping, picnicking, kayaking, swimming and fishing. It is also immediately adjacent to the Peacock Gap neighborhood, and the park's hills can be seen from many homes in Peacock Gap.

Although China Camp is a well-used state park, it is on the list of parks to be closed to help end the state's budget crisis. We need to protect this park and keep it open.



With a county road going through China Camp, this state park is particularly unsuitable for closure as it will be at risk of misuse due to the ease of access this road provides. Severe erosion could occur from uncontrolled mountain biking, along with homeless encampments and illegal campfires. Misuse and neglect could adversely affect the fragile saltwater marshes and wildlife, and could impact the entire San Francisco bay.

Never in the history of California, even during the 1930s Great Depression, were any state parks ever closed. We need to take action now to help prevent this from happening. Please see this flyer for action you can take to help save China Camp.
